Re: Upcoming concrete pours for Drumnahough Wind Farm

Dear Householder,

Further to the recent newsletter you will have received providing an update on the construction of Drumnahough Wind Farm, we are writing to notify you of upcoming concrete pours for the project. This phase of work will result in a temporary increase in traffic from the N13, along the L2744 to the Meentycat Wind Farm entrance, see map overleaf for reference.

By way of reminder, Drumnahough Wind Farm is a 12-turbine, 58MW onshore wind project being developed by SSE and FuturEnergy Ireland, to be located next to the existing Culliagh, Meentycat and Lenalea wind farms. The project received planning permission in September 2022, with construction commencing in January 2026. Construction has progressed well in recent months and has included: tree felling, environmental surveys, construction of internal access tracks and hardstands, installation of site compounds, and the preparation of borrow pits to facilitate on-site excavation.

From approximately early July, construction will progress to the pouring of turbine foundations. These works will be carried out on a phased basis over the coming months, with completion targeted for the autumn. Each turbine foundation will be poured over a continuous period, requiring a steady flow of concrete delivery vehicles travelling to and from the site.

During this period, you may notice:

- An increase in heavy goods vehicle movements from the N13, along the L2744 to the Meentycat Wind Farm entrance
- Activity within the site during pouring periods
- Occasional extended working hours where continuous pours are required

To minimise disruption, the following measures will be implemented:

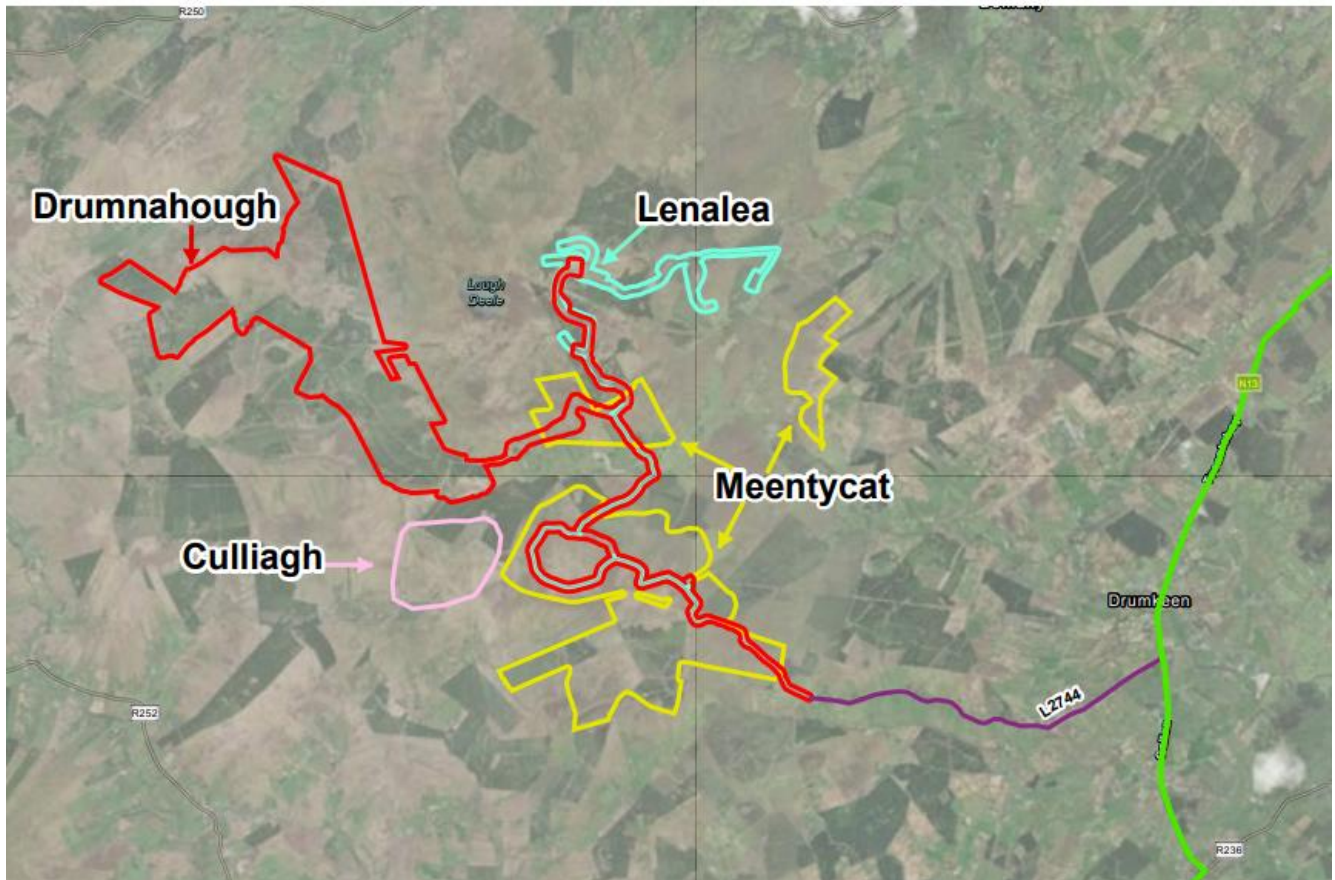
- Managed routing of construction traffic via the designated site entrance and approved route
- Coordination of deliveries to avoid peak traffic periods, where possible
- On-site traffic management and safety controls
- Ongoing monitoring of traffic movements

As noted, concrete pours are currently scheduled to commence in early July, with works taking place during the approved construction period. We will continue to keep this schedule under review and will provide updates if there are any significant changes.
